MARCH SPEAKER – ADAMBLACK

Adam Black is Horticultural Director of Peckerwood Gardens in Hempstead, Texas. Peckerwood Gardens is a collection of more than 3,000 plants including many rarities; It is a conservation garden containing examples of numerous threaten species, many of which are no longer in found in the wild. Previously he was the manager of the forest pathology and entomology laboratories at the University of Florida in Gainesville, Florida.



Adam is a plant explorer who has sought out outstanding forms of American trees in the Southwest, many of which have great potential to grow in Colorado.

CACTUS OF THE MONTH:

Gymnocalycium - This genus name (from Greek, "naked calyx") refers to the flower buds bearing no hair or spines. There are roughly 70 species of gymnocalycium.

Their main area of distribution is Argentina, part of Uruguay, Paraguay, southern Bolivia and part of Brazil. Most species are rather small varying from 4 to 15 centimeters in size.

In cultivation they are popular for their easy flowering habits, and the flowers are generally brightly colored.

SUCCULENT OF THE MONTH:

Haworthia - A large genus of small succulent plants native to Southern Africa. It is named after the botanist Adrian Hardy Haworth, formerly of Hull, England.

Haworthia has recently been split into Haworthia, Haworthiopsis and Tulista, although for the sake to March's show, they are all one very big happy family.

Haworthia are closely related to Aloes, Gasterias and Astrolobas, to the point where intergeneric hybrids are possible, but please don't bring those.

Cash Registers and Exit

The main room is roughly 50% larger than Mitchell Hall, and will provide lots of space for even more vendor tables. Behind the Sale Room are two small rooms. One will host the Plant Show, and the second one will serve as the staging area or something else to be determined. But surely will be fun!

Behind the two smaller rooms is the kitchen. Like the DBG, we can "use" the kitchen as long as we don't use the kitchen. We'll have enough space to spread out food and plug in a coffee pot.

Exiting the Sale Room leads to a large hallway. This hallway will take the customer to the cash registers. All five registers will be in this foyer. Once the plants have been paid for it's a short walk to the door and on to parking. The parking lot is large, with roughly twice the number of spaces as the Botanic Gardens. And most of them are close to the building's front door.

YOUR SHOW & SALE "TODOLIST"

Get Some S&S Flyers...And hand them out! Next to social media, and simple word of mouth, this is one of out most effective methods of advertising.

Prepare Your Plants...Collect top dressing and pots in advance, don't wait until the last minute.

Find Containers and Boxes...Use them to transport your Show Plants to the Summit Events Center. And write your name on them so they aren't recycled.

Collect Beer Flats, Soda Pop Flats, and Other Small Boxes...Customers will use these boxers to carry their plants, both in the Sale Room and then to their car.

Take Photos of Your Plants...One of the most important keys to great photography is great lighting! Watch for "that right time of day" and snap away.

DETAILS, RULES, AND THIS YEAR – PRIZE INFORMATION

Contest Details: This contest is for stand-alone photographs and photo albums (or montages) of cactus and/ or succulent pictures. Entries will be judged on artistic and/or scientific value. One entrant may enter up to five items per category.

Entries that are not in an album should be 8"x10" or larger and be mounted. All entries should be printed on photo paper. Only the photo itself (not the presentation) will be taken into account when judging. Photograph must be taken by the entrant. The entrant will retain full ownership of the photograph(s).

There are two categories that photographs can be entered:

1. Stand-alone photographs

2. Photo albums or photo montages.

In accordance with show rules, there can only be one first place ribbon awarded per category.

There can, however, be more than one second and third place ribbons awarded as the judging team sees fit.

The best entry between the two categories will be awarded a \$100 gift card to Englewood Camera as the grand prize.

Judging is to take place at 7:00am on Saturday, April 6, 2019.

The contest is open to both CCSS members and non-members.
